


Higher Education at Northern Regional College

Higher Level Apprenticeship in Engineering

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Having completed the Foundation Degree in Engineering both Adam and Cameron were able to progress directly to the second year of a BEng (Hons) degree at Ulster University.

Describing the Foundation Degree as "everything I could ever want", Adam explained: I left school after A-levels but didn't feel ready for university. I decided to do a Foundation Degree in Mechanical and Manufacturing Engineering at Northern Regional College and found the experience invaluable.

A Foundation Degree is the perfect stepping-stone for university. I developed a variety of skills, including industrial robotics programming, material testing, CAD (computer aided design) and quality analysis skills and got valuable practical, hands-on experience of using machinery.
